FREE SENIOR CITIZEN PROGRAMS



- **Home Security Program**
Free home security surveys and safety modifications are provided to seniors and persons with disabilities
- **Senior Citizen Police Academy**
An informational program on various crime prevention and law enforcement topics is provided for senior citizens.
- **MedInfo Program**
Comprehensive medical history forms are provided by the senior or their doctor, outlining the medical history of the senior. This medical history is placed in the home refrigerator with special decals to alert first responders that this crucial information is available.
- **Senior Citizens Identification (ID) Cards**
Free photo identification cards are provided to seniors.
- **TRIAD Information Calendar**
Each year free calendars packed with information of importance to seniors are distributed.
- **TRIAD Hotline**
Seniors needing assistance can call CONTACT's 24-hour hotlines for assistance and referrals, 856-234-8888
- **Law Enforcement Referral Program**
Police officers who encounter seniors in need of services can quickly notify agencies who can provide the needed assistance.
- **9-1-1 Emergency Cell Phone Program**
Free cellular telephones are provided to seniors and persons with disabilities for Emergency 9-1-1 access.
- **Project Lifesaver**
Special Bracelets with tracking devices are provided to those who may wander from home and become lost.
- **Senior Expo**
This annual event brings area agencies who serve seniors together to provide information in a face to face setting.
- **Persons-At-Risk Program**
A confidential police computer database containing crucial descriptive information and a current photograph is available to register a family member who may suffer from a physical or mental disability, which may cause them to wander and be unable to return home unassisted. This provides law enforcement officials with the immediate vital descriptive information, should your loved one be reported missing or found wandering by police.
